ADK Bylaws Vote

The September Adirondac should arrive in your mailbox in the next few days. In it, you will be asked to review and vote on proposed amendments to the club's bylaws. These amendments include two key provisions:

- 1. Currently, the members, through the chapters, elect ADK's Board of Directors. Under the new bylaws, the Board of Directors will elect itself.
- 2. Currently, only the members can amend the bylaws. Under the new bylaws, only the Board of Directors can amend the bylaws.

Together, these two provisions give control of ADK to a Board that need not answer to the Club's members. There are other aspects of the proposed amendments, such as a vaguely-worded requirement about Board members' financial contributions and the lack of a diversity requirement, that are further cause for concern.

The Laurentian Chapter Executive Committee believes these amendments are not good for ADK, ADK's members, or ADK's staff and other stakeholders. We recommend voting against the proposed amendments.



With the improvement in New York State's Covid-19 situation and the easing of the state's safety rules, the Chapter is planning five outings this fall:

Saturday, September 19 - A hike into Church Pond from Route 56 will involve some bushwhacking into a piece of Forest Preserve with big trees and a quiet pond. This is the headwaters of the North Branch of the Grass(e). Expect wet feet. We'll spend the morning thrashing through the woods and some may want to climb nearby Catamount in the afternoon. Sunday, October 4 - Peavine Swamp Christmas Tree Loop. We'll start at the Rte 3 end of the trail where there is plenty of parking. The trail has some sections with rolling hills

and some large magnificent trees. We are hoping to still have beautiful foliage to enjoy. We will keep a comfortable pace and have a break for lunch. It is about a 5.5 mile hike - level 3. Saturday, October 10 - Lost Pond Trail at Cranberry Lake, 2 miles rd. Easy, some rolling hills, circling the pond. An osprey nest, maybe we will see them and hopefully fall foliage. I will have maps of the Tooley Pond waterfalls along Tooley Pond Road which people can chose to continue on their own. Level 3. Limited to 10 participants. Social distancing with masks.
